## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

While young families are preparing to re-enter schools us old folks are gathering in the harvest. My tomatoes are really ripening fast and furious. I noticed that Tom Klecker had a beautiful large tomato that really was larger than mine, but Bea and Bernie Imholte had a tomato that weighed 2 lbs +. That is a giant however, you must not only have great measurements a good grower aims for taste. We are all winners this year. Congratulations! I bring Buster outside while I pick and count my produce daily. Buster plunks down on the dirt which used to be flowers and just lays there. So that is the state of the rectory currently. I have noticed an increase in the numbers attending masses. There were about 70 in St. Joe on Sunday morning and 150/60 at St. John Baptist. People really like the outdoor masses and it makes me think that in the future, post COVID we should do the same. This Tuesday the Church has a day of prayer for the care of creation. We humans have to make amends to nature by caring for nature and not abusing it. This applies to the earth and oceans but also to care for the living creatures and those thousands just conceived. Speaking of the unborn I am working on a "memorial to the unborn" using granite left over from our renovation to be placed in the south cemetery. I expect it will be quite large. We hope to place it up on a berm with plantings around it. Please visit the cemetery and see what fine work has been done on the "urn garden". It is impressive! We are moving into September and God only knows what that will mean with the virus. I have a document from "Catholic Advocacy Network" concerning having an informed electorate. Some of the questions to ask of our candidates : their position is on physician-assisted suicide, clean water initiatives, school choice initiatives, immigrant driver's licenses, racial equity and inclusion and abortion—and many more important issues we need to think about as we choose our candidates. No one issue is to be the driving force of your vote. I hope that this summary is helpful to you.

## GOSPEL REFLECTION—AUGUST 30

To the secular mind, the wisdom and ideals of the Gospel are making less and less sense. Consider for a moment this question: “What profit would there be for one to gain the whole world and forfeit his life?” While Jesus is asking this very challenging question to people who are considering his message, many in our world are in a quite different place. Whether we realize it, many folks are asking a much different question. Why would you not want to gain the whole world and secure your life? If you look at where a lot of folks are investing their time, energy, and resources, it becomes obvious where current priorities rest.

Modern day comforts and possibilities are backing us out of our relationship with God. The fire burning in every human heart is trying to find its satisfaction in the things that humans have created and not God. Being altruistic and offering compassion for those most in need becomes a political responsibility or responsible gesture. We realize that our hearts need to be centered on something and someone who calls us out of ourselves, but we struggle and battle with naming the source of that call. God places the desire to seek, find, and love Him in the core of every soul. We are not abandoned and left to fend for ourselves. But we can easily get confused. We know that when we extend ourselves to another self-sacrificially, we are doing what is just and right. We know that we can work through suffering and loss and come out better and more whole on the other side.

Our minds need to be renewed so that they can begin to understand that there is much more to who we are, and that faith plays a pivotal role in achieving our true and everlasting goals. It is when we see that it is only faith that can bring us to this heightened awareness of ourselves and God that it will begin to make sense. Then, we can put things in proper perspective and consider being a disciple.

## GOSPEL REFLECTION—SEPTEMBER 6

“IF TODAY YOU HEAR GOD’S VOICE, HARDEN NOT YOUR HEARTS”

This response to the first reading in today’s liturgy sets the tone for all of the readings. It challenges us to be alert to the circumstances in which we hear God’s voice. The readings call us to be aware of the actions of others and to help them to see the consequences that may come to them.

In the reading from Romans, we are reminded that we are to love our neighbor as ourselves. The question is, “how do we love ourselves?” Often it is easier to love others; to be a good listener, a kind-hearted person, generous in not making judgments and others. Do I treat myself in the same way? Do I respect myself enough to take time to be and to pray? Do I care for my spouse, family and community members and encourage them in their daily lives or do I just sit back, criticize and judge them? Am I gentle with myself, believing that I am loved by God, and when I make a mistake that I will be forgiven?

Where will you hear God’s voice today? It may be in the cry of a small child, the smile of a grandparent, or the words of the Sunday homily! How will those who meet you hear God’s voice? Will it be a kind word, an invitation to share a meal, a cry for someone to listen? Be aware this week of the messages you give to others, the messages you receive from others, and of the messages you give to yourself. May God bless you with an attentive ear!
