Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick Saturday, October 22, 5:00 pm



*Are there any who are sick among you?
Let them send for the priests of the Church,
and let the priests pray over them, anointing
them with oil in the name of the Lord;
and the prayer of faith will save the sick
persons, and the Lord will raise them up;
and if they have committed any sins,
their sins will be forgiven them.*

—James 5:13-15

The Anointing of the Sick is a sacrament for anyone of the faithful who begins to be in danger of death from physical or mental illness or old age. A sick person may be anointed before surgery or whenever a serious illness is the reason for the surgery; persons with a chronic illness or elderly persons may be anointed if they have become notably weakened, even if they have no serious illness.

There are times when older age and illness and the fears that sometimes accompany them need to be brought to the healing and comforting touch of Christ. It is a touching moment when a parish community sees their senior members and those burdened by sickness or disability come forward to receive the Sacrament of Anointing.

The Sacrament of Anointing will be offered at the 5:00 pm Mass on Saturday, October 22.

Liturgy Spotlight

New Mass Texts: The Prayer of the Church

No matter how we embrace this watershed moment of change in the liturgy, we need always to remember that words alone, whether new or old are not what save us. Only Christ does that! Bear in mind: the new Mass texts need to be embraced as being the authentic prayer of the Church of **today**, which exists and carries out its mission within the milieu of today's world and this moment in time. Some of the "new" texts may actually sound like a return to forms that were used previously. Perhaps this is so. Yet, a translation cannot be successfully promulgated and embraced based on its being the prayer of some previous generation that we are now re-discovering or re-creating. A spirit of liturgical restorationism...a looking to the past merely for the sake of recreating the past... will get us nowhere. It will fail to make our worship any more authentic, alive or life-giving to those who celebrate it than it already is. Like the seed planted on rocky ground in the familiar gospel story, such an agenda will lack roots and will eventually fail to thrive or bear fruit for the long haul. No, the new Mass texts will serve us better the more we embrace them as being the prayer of **our** time and place. In other words, we need to bear in mind that as we pray them, they are indeed the words of **today's** Church at prayer. The new Mass texts will soon be on the lips of the many saints, sinners and prophets of **our day** and of **our** place and time. Yet, whether the words we use are entirely new or a return to older forms, one thing will remain true as it has for generations: we will be praying them in union with Christ our High Priest and in union with the communion of saints, the countless generations of believers who have gone before us, who now worship God in heaven. With this as our perspective, we will soon realize that very little will be changing at all!
