Learning about the Diocese of Vijayapuram

Christianity is India's third largest religion with approximately 24 million followers, constituting 2.3% of India's population. Scholars and Eastern Christian writings state that Saint Thomas the Apostle introduced Christianity to India in 52 A.D. Although its exact origins in India remain unclear, it is generally agreed that Christianity in India is almost as old as Christianity itself and spread in India even before it spread in many, predominantly Christian, nations of Europe. Most Christians in India are Roman Catholic (Latin Rite). However, the Syro-Malabar Catholic Church and the Malankara Orthodox Syrian Church, both Eastern Rite churches, are prominent in Kerala. There are also many protestant and evangelical churches represented.

Announcing a **NEW** Musical Group in our parish!

Beginning in October, we will have a "Resurrection Choir" (Funeral Choir) to sing at funeral liturgies. This will be a ministry of **presence** as well as music. Resurrection choirs are yet another way in which the parish community can gather around and support those mourning the loss of a loved one. They give powerful witness to our belief in the Resurrection by their mere presence as well as the message they help proclaim in song. They can greatly encourage assembly participation at funerals. They also communicate in a non-verbal manner that funerals are indeed parish-wide celebrations of the liturgy.

The Resurrection Choir will be open to all parishioners. You do not need to be already involved in any other choir or facet of the parish music ministry in order to participate. There are no rehearsals, only a brief warm-up prior to each funeral Mass. Since a Resurrection Choir only assists in leading the song of the assembly, all repertoire is "known" simply by being a member of our parish.. (i.e., The choir does not have the added work load of preparing special "choir pieces" or singing in "parts," both of which would require rehearsals.) When a funeral occurs, members are notified by volunteers. They are free to respond, "Yes, I can sing." or "No, I am not available this time." In other words, members are free to sing for as many funerals as they find themselves available. For examples: because of work, a person may only be available for an occasional Saturday funeral. "Snowbirds"/retirees may only be available during certain months of the year. Still others may be available year 'round and therefore able to sing for almost every funeral that occurs. All of these situations can work in a Resurrection Choir.
