Confirmation Large Group Session next Sunday, February 6! This session is for all 9th and 10th graders and their catechists, beginning at 3:30 pm and concluding at 5:00 pm. (Catechists are reminded to arrive no later than 3:00 pm.) Our topic for the session is *"The Holy Spirit and Super Sunday"* with Greg Spofford, PMin, as presenter. Attention to parents/guardians of 9th and 10th graders: To be in compliance with the policy of the United States Catholic Conference of Bishops in the Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, we are required each year to offer training about personal safety in our Catholic schools and faith formation programs. This year for the 9th and 10th graders we will be using *Personal Power: A Gut Check on Safety*. We will be showing this video to grades 9 and 10 at their large group gathering on Sunday, February 6. Saint Blaise Blessing of Throats

Thursday, February 3, is the feast of Saint Blaise, Bishop and Martyr. The traditional Blessing of Throats associated with this feast will be offered after the weekday liturgy as well as after all liturgies next weekend, February 5-6. Saint Blaise is said to have saved a boy who was choking on a fish bone, hence the connection with this blessing given on his feast day.

The New Mass Texts Frequently Asked Question #7

Will parishes have to buy new hymnals?

This new translation brings a change in some of the musical texts we use during the Mass. The Gloria has changed, along with the Holy, Holy and Memorial Acclamations. We will no longer be able to sing, “Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.” These changes will result in having to learn new Mass settings. Composers and publishing companies have been working very hard to set the new texts to new music, and to revise their existing Mass settings. It may be time for some parishes to purchase a new hymnal anyway; others might simply purchase a supplement put out by their hymnal’s publisher.

“Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.”

What does it mean to be “poor in spirit?” Around Christmas time I had the opportunity of watching the movie *Forrest Gump*, a movie I have seen at least three times. Forrest would be a good example of someone who is poor in spirit, someone who happened to acquire significant money, but he didn’t obsess about it. Rather, he chose to spend his time, money, and energy on those people and activities which brought him the most joy and satisfaction. Money meant very little to Forrest, and he gave freely of what he had when he became aware of a need or opportunity. It is called detachment. When Jesus said, “Blessed are the poor in spirit,” he was inviting us to appreciate and use what we have, but to remain free and detached so that we can be available to others with our time, talent, and treasure without strings. We are free to acknowledge that money is good and necessary, while at the same time acknowledging that there are other, more meaningful values in our life which take precedence over stockpiling treasures. Jesus also said, “Where your treasure is, there is your heart.” Maybe it is time to review what our treasures really are and where our heart lies. Blessings and God’s peace be yours.
