Quenching Our Thirst... In the first reading the people grumbled against Moses because they were thirsty. Thousands of years later, almost one billion people still thirst for clean water. Many women, like the Samaritan woman in the Gospel, spend thousands of hours each year pumping and carrying water for their families. Often, this grueling physical labor leads to health problems like muscle strains, exhaustion, and severe pain. The New Mass Texts - Penitential Act "C"

This week we present the last of the three options for the Penitential Act, "Form C," which will be included in the new English translation of the 3rd edition of The Roman Missal. This form is also offered in the current Mass texts and enjoys wide use and familiarity. In fact, this form is the one used here at the Church of Saint Joseph on a majority of weekends. The format will remain the same: a series of three invocations will be offered by the priest or deacon, each followed by either a "Lord, have mercy" or "Christ, have mercy" dialogue with the assembly. The invocations themselves may still be changed to suit the season or liturgical themes of the day.

Priest: You were sent to heal the contrite of heart:
Lord, have mercy. (*or "Kyrie, eleison"*)

People: **Lord, have mercy.** (*or "Kyrie, eleison"*)

Priest: You came to call sinners:
Christ, have mercy. (*or "Christe, eleison"*)

People: **Christ, have mercy.** (*or "Christe, eleison"*)

Priest: You are seated at the right hand of the Father to intercede for us:
Lord, have mercy. (*or "Kyrie, eleison"*)

People: **Lord, have mercy.** (*or "Kyrie, eleison"*)

Priest: May almighty God have mercy on us,
forgive us our sins,
and bring us to everlasting life.

People: **Amen.**
